1) CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Simon called the Waterfront Advisory Committee meeting of April 6, 2026 to order at 4:00 p.m.

2) REFERRALS

- a) *Referral from Village Board of Trustees for a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) Consistency Review for Local Law Introductory 7 of 2026, the EAF and the CAF to amend the provisions of Chapter 179 "Property Maintenance" and Chapter 230, "Zoning," of the Village Code to revise the law governing posted signs.*

Vincent Salanitro summarized that the Village Board of Trustees is looking to tidy up the Village code, making it clearer and easier to administer. There are new definitions in the code, and new size requirements in commercial districts.

The WAC reviewed the Coastal Assessment Form and no changes were noted.

Leo Wiegman made a motion to accept the Coastal Assessment Form, seconded by Stuart Greenbaum, and the motion carried, 5 – 0.

The WAC reviewed the Short Environmental Assessment Form and determined that there were no changes necessary.

Leo Wiegman made a motion to accept the Short Environmental Assessment Form, seconded by Steve Krisky, and the motion carried, 5 - 0.

The WAC reviewed the 44 LWRP policies and found that none were applicable, as noted in the memo attached. Since there is nothing in the referrals that is inconsistent, the WAC made a recommendation of consistency.

MOTION: Stuart Greenbaum made a recommendation of consistency, seconded by Leo Wiegman, and the motion carried, 5 - 0.

- b) *Referral from Village Board of Trustees to review correspondence from State of New York, Department of Transportation for a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) Consistency review regarding improving consistency in curve warning signage across the state*

Vincent Salanitro summarized the application stating that NYSDOT is looking to change out some existing signage across the state by relocating, and or replacing existing horizontal curve warning signs and installing new curve warning signs that are uniform across the state. There are eight (8) signs in the Village that will be replaced. The project is federally funded.

The WAC reviewed the 44 LWRP policies and identified applicable policies, as noted in the memo attached. Since there is nothing in the referrals that is inconsistent, the WAC made a recommendation of consistency.
