**A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE
VILLAGE OF ESTERO, FLORIDA, AMENDING
RESOLUTION NO. 2021-16 ADOPTING PERSONNEL
POLICIES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2016-06 establishes the content of and methods for adoption, amendment and revisions to Personnel Policies; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2016-09 was adopted on June 1, 2016 and amended by Resolution No. 2016-36 on November 16, 2016; and amended by Resolution No. 2019-14 on September 4, 2019; and amended by Resolution No. 2020-17 on September 9, 2020; and amended by Resolution No. 2021-16 on September 22, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council hereby amends the Personnel Policies in appreciation of staff efforts during the COVID Crisis to maintain a continuous commitment to high quality service to the community, to allow for additional pay out to Directors and the Executive Assistant of up to a total of one hundred sixty (160) hours in lieu of accrued unused Payed Time Off (PTO) for the fiscal years 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 only.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Village Council of the Village of Estero, Florida:

Section 1. Resolution No. 2021-16 amends Section 3-03 PTO item A.2. as follows:

“For fiscal year 2021-2022, as the result of continuing impacts of COVID-19, staff have been unable to take time off as provided in personnel policies; therefore, an additional pay out to Directors and the Executive Assistant of up to a total of one hundred sixty (160) hours of unused PTO will be allowed for the fiscal years 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 only.”

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
