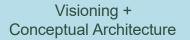

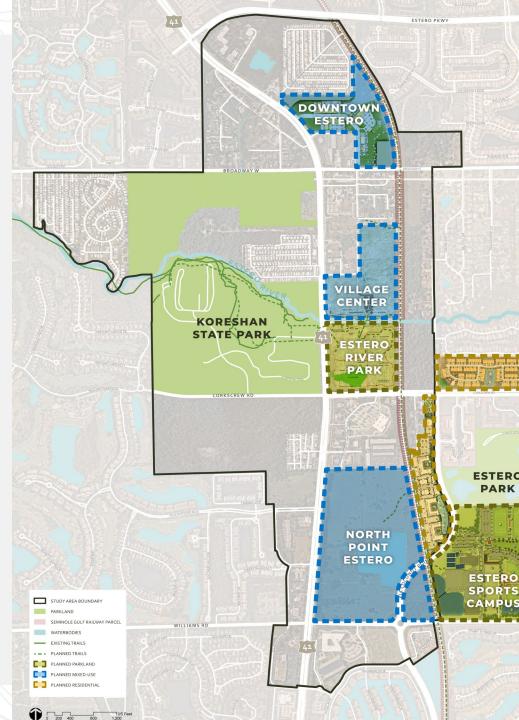




## **Study Area**

- Planned BERT corridor





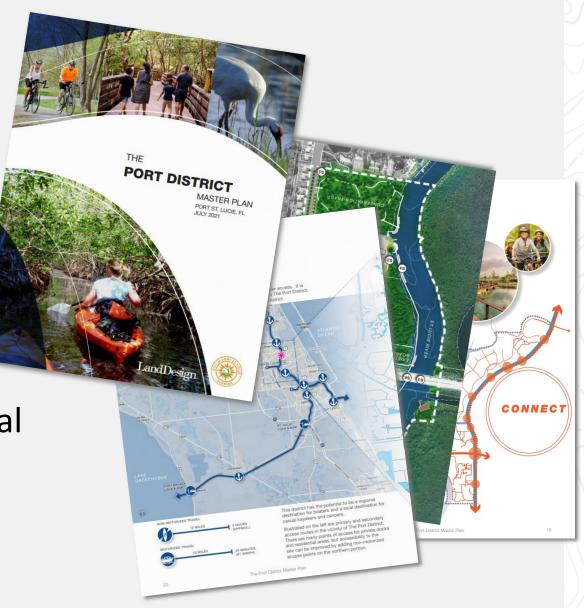

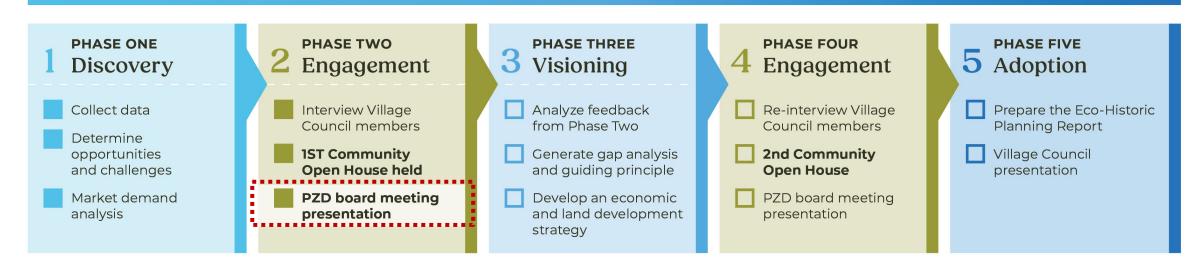

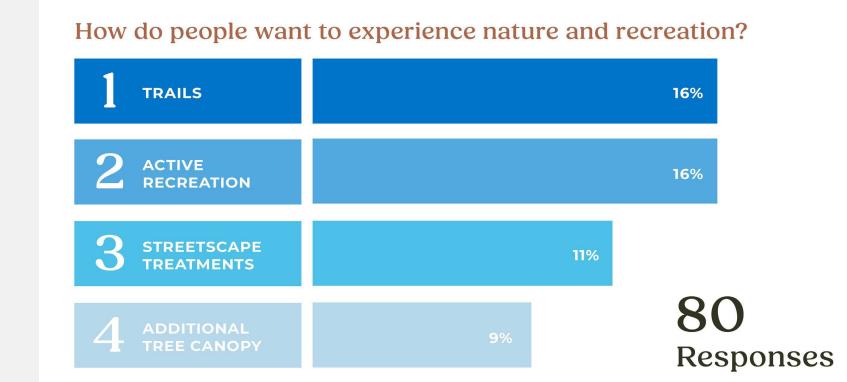






## **Summary of Feedback**

### What kind of commercial development?

"Walkable, mixed-use neighborhood" and "Village Center" images received the highest concentration of dots for types of mixed-use development.



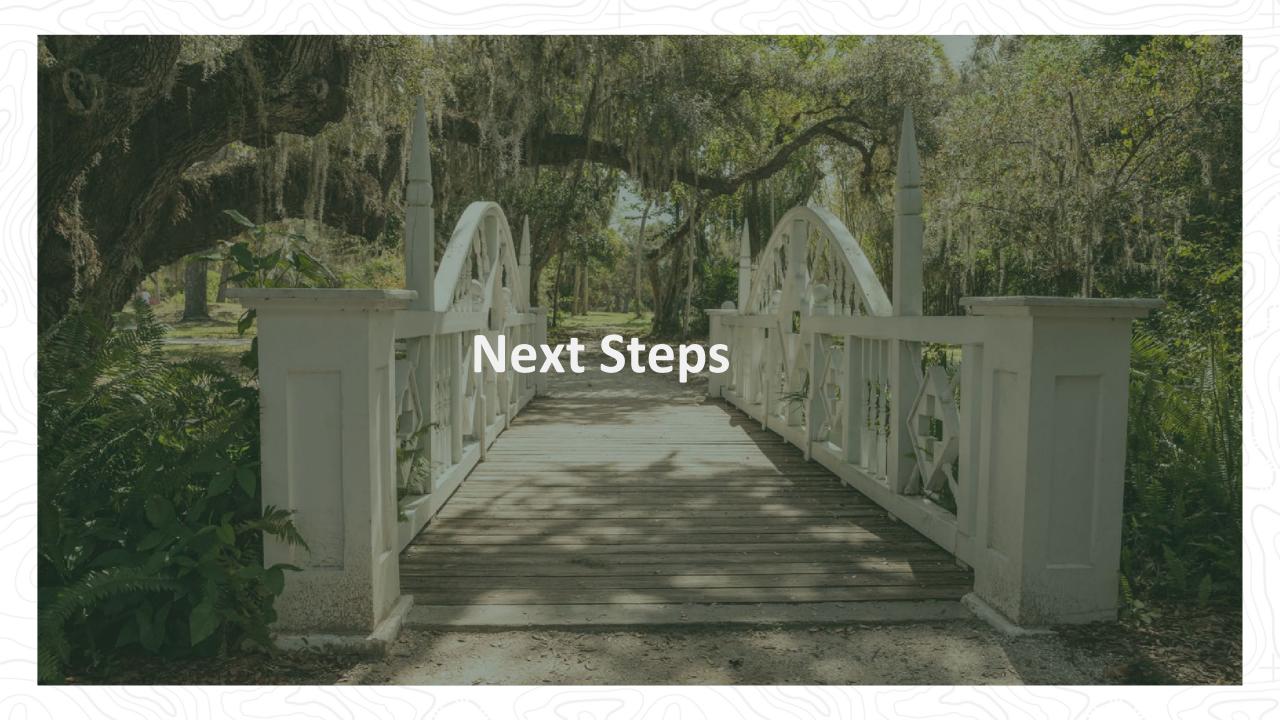






"Restaurants" and
