Town of Thompson's Station Utility Board Meeting Minutes October 19, 2022, 6:00 p.m.

Call to Order:

Utility Board Members and staff attending the meeting were: Chairman Jeff Risden, Alderman Brian Stover, Utility Board Members Skip Beasley, Charles Stark, Finance Director Steve Banks, Wastewater Operator Kenny Bond, and Town Attorney Kirk Vandivort. Board Members Bruce Difrancisco, and Joshua Mayo, Town Administrator Ken McLawhon and Town Clerk Regina Fowler were absent.

Minutes:

1. Consideration of the Minutes of the July 20, 2022, regular meeting:

Mr. Skip Beasley made a motion to approve the July 20, 2022, regular meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Brian Stover and carried 4 yay 0 nay.

2. **System Operator's Update – Kenny Bond:**

Nothing new, cell one is approximately 18" below the top of the aerators. We should be in good shape for the rainy season. Effluent has gone down quite a bit. The new drip fields are going well, we have had a few small repairs.

3. Regional Wastewater Plant NPDES Permit Scope and Next Steps – Matthew Johnson:

In discussions with TDEC a potential surface water discharge permit was discussed. The use of two water sheds, West Harpeth & Duck River were discussed, potentially utilizing the West Harpeth due to infrastructure already being in place and subsequently being adjacent to the West Harpeth Water Shed. Before a permit application, TDEC encouraged the Town to work with their modeler's, study and understand the model and assumptions and review data to include the permit limits to be included in the permit application hopefully unifying TDEC and the Town to be in agreement. Once that step has been completed, the permit application would follow. Should the Town agree with this route Barge would provide an agreement (to go before BOMA) as to the scope of the first few tasks and define the permit limits. The modeling is to determine impact to W. Harpeth due to the amount of waste that would be discharged into the water. This would not necessarily do away with our drip fields. TDEC encouraged utilizing them to eliminate as much water from them prior to waste release into the West Harpeth. This would be a hybrid system. Mr. Skip Beasley made a motion to approve a recommendation to BOMA to approve a contract with Barge Design to pursue modeling with TDEC for direct discharge. Mr. Charles Stark seconded the motion and it passed 5 yay 0 nay.
