- Actual 2025-26 enrollment is lower than the medium and high model, however, it is in alignment with low.
- For the medium model, greatest deviation at the elementary level (-63), particularly driven by a smaller K cohort and lower in-migration especially in 1<sup>st</sup> grade, where actuals were 12 students below projected.
- Middle and high school enrollment was higher than projections for all three models.



# Kindergarten Entry Date Impacts

- New Kindergarten entry date became effective for 2024-25 school year per state law.
- For children who turn 5 years old after September 1<sup>st</sup>, state law allows for a parent to request an exception to enter their child in kindergarten.
- From 2021-22 to 2024-25, WPS averaged 44 kindergarteners who turned 5 years old after September 1<sup>st</sup>.
- For 2025-26, just 1 kindergartener turned 5 years old after September 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - This is 43 students lower than the four-year average, which explains the entire delta at Kindergarten for 2025-26.
- **This year’s small kindergarten class is a one-time event driven by the change in entry age change.**
- Future kindergarten projections will assume a continuation of 2025-26 trends.

# Projections Comparison by Elementary

- All schools were below the projected enrollment, with Greens Farm having the greatest deviation at -35 students.
- Coleytown, Long Lots and Saugatuck deviated less than 10 students from actuals.
- Kindergarten enrollment notably lower at Greens Farms.

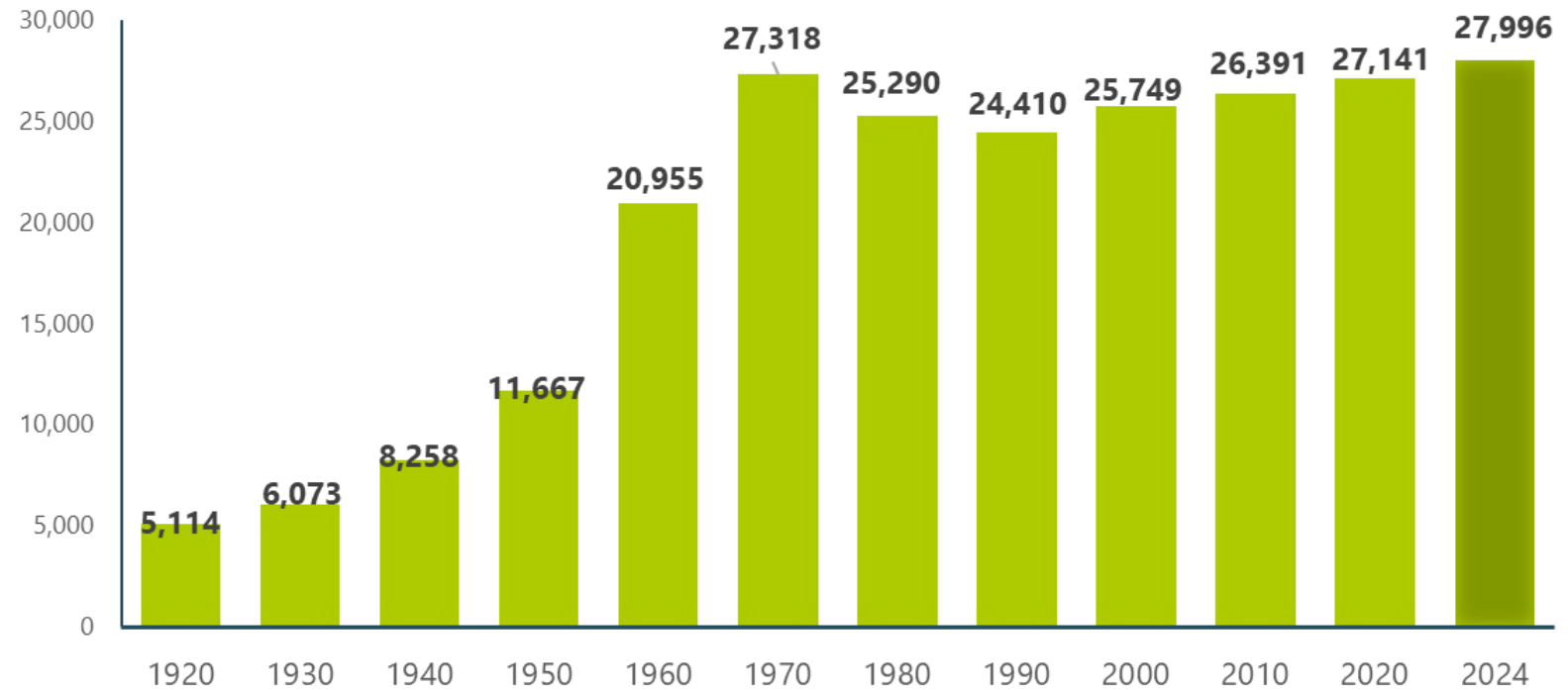

# Westport's Population

- According to 2020 Decennial Census, Westport's total population grew by 750 or 2.8% between 2010 & 2020.
- CTDPH Population estimates for 2024 estimate Westport's population is 27,996 a growth of about 3.2% since 2020.

### Town of Westport Total Population



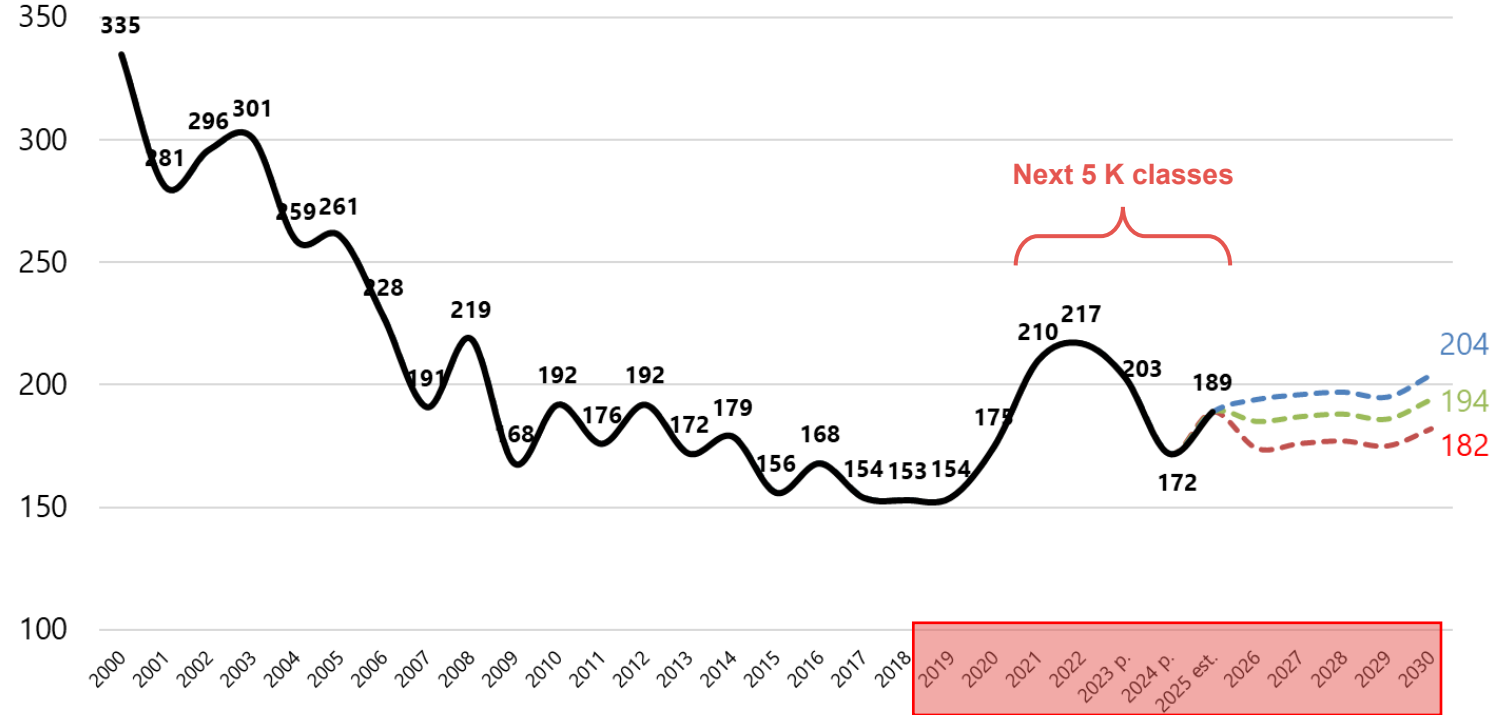

# Reported Birth & Projections

- Beginning in 2019, births transitioned from calendar year to September-August to align with new CT entry age requirements (this year's Kindergarten cohort).
- After seeing elevated births from 2020 to 2023, 2024 births dipped to 172. However, estimates for 2025 based on Jan.-Jun. YTD, show a slight rebound to 189.
- Baseline medium birth projections are based off a blended demographic and mathematical model.
- Birth projections assume different growth factors for high and low birth projections.
- All three models yield a continuation of the elevated births, which are below the elevated births of the last 3-years, but above the pre-pandemic levels.
  - Low model: avg. 177
  - Medium model: avg. 188
  - High model: avg. 197

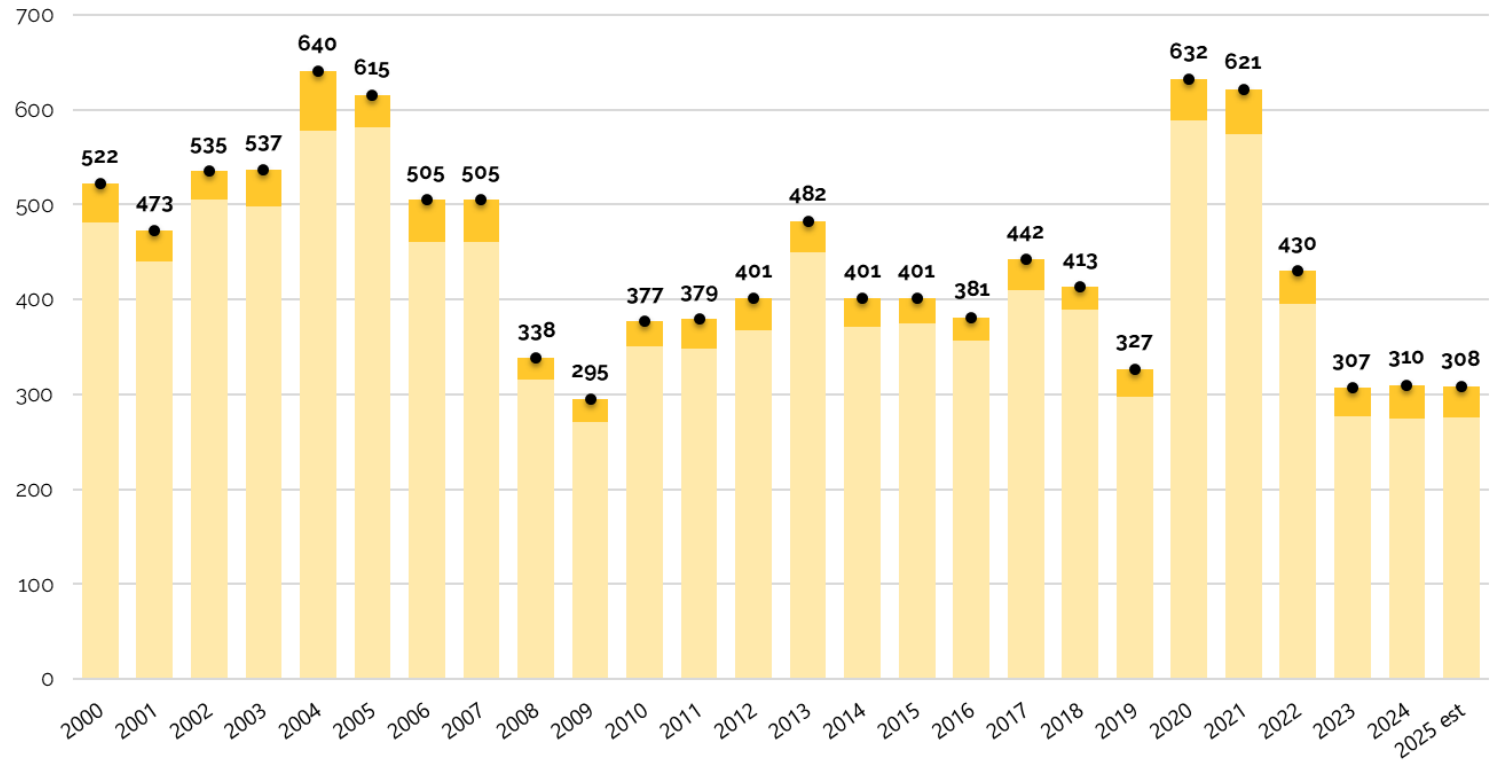

# Housing Market

- Significant jump in sales in 2020 and 2021, with sales equaling peak seen in the mid-2000s prior to the Great Recession.
- Sales slowed in 2022, returning to levels seen during the pre-pandemic period.
- Over the last three years, including 2025 YTD, sales have averaged about 309 annually. 2009 was the only year with fewer home sales.
- Single-family sales decreased at a faster rate (-52%) than condominiums(-32%) since 2021.
- Reduced inventory and high prices are all contributing factors to current housing market conditions.

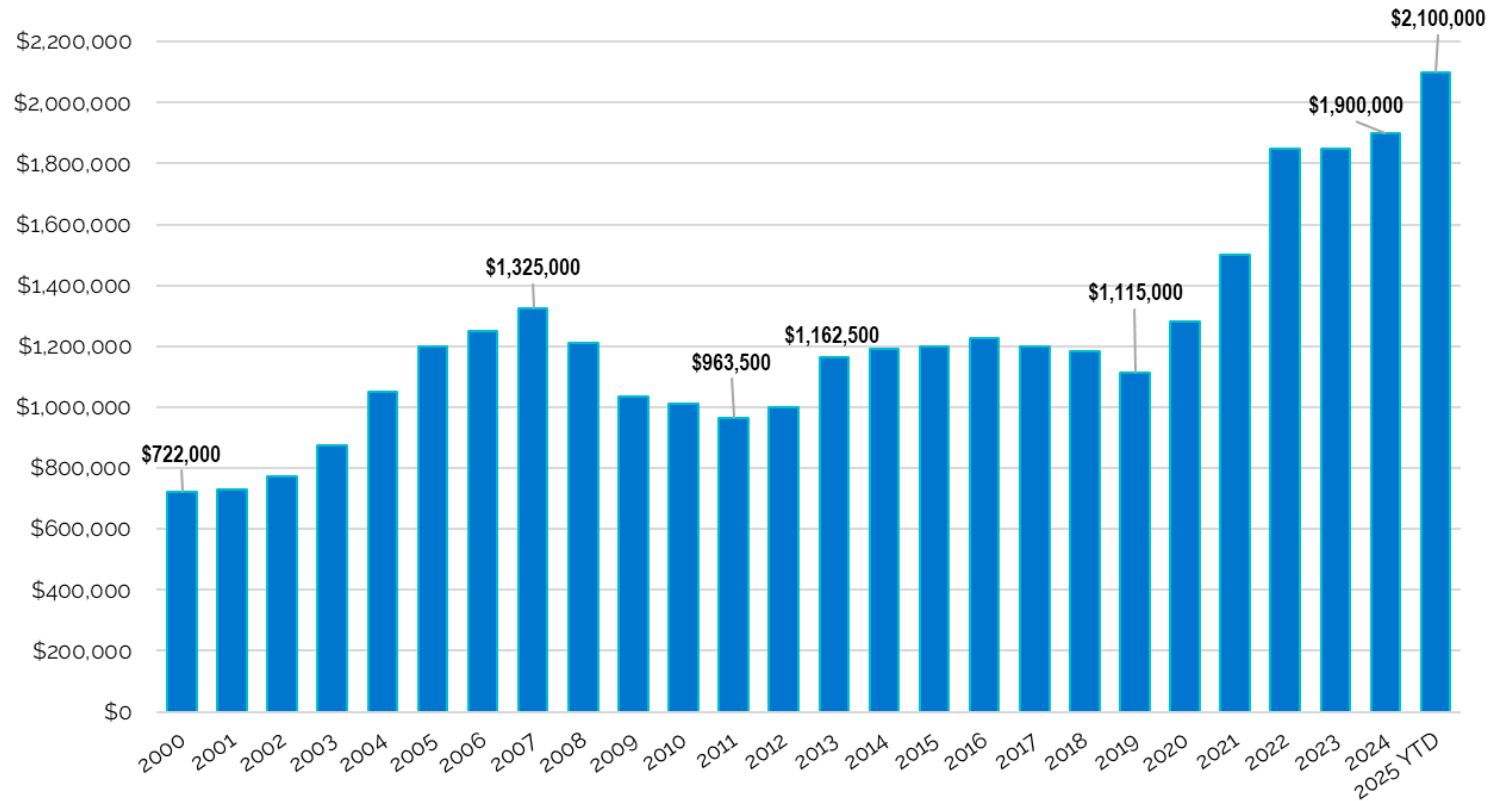
Single-Family Condo Total



# Housing Market

- Dramatic increase in median single-family sale price since 2019, increasing by 88% to \$2.1 million for 2025 YTD.
- Single-family home sale prices now greatly exceed levels during the prior housing peak of the early 2000's
- Median sale price for condos is \$1.1 million YTD, up from \$575K in 2019

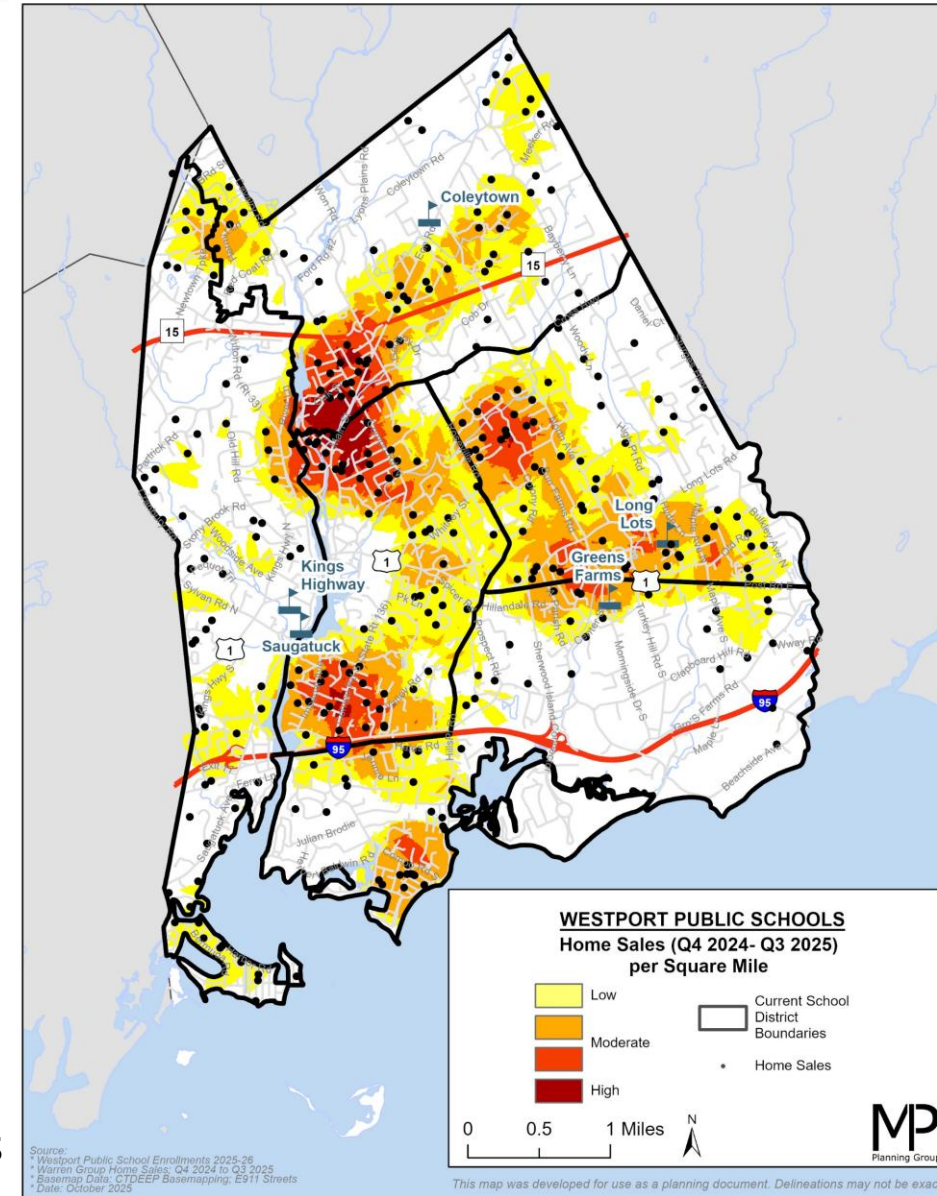


# Home Sale "Hotspot"

- The greatest density of recent home sales are located near Compo Cove, Route 1 West near Long Lots and Greens Farms, Long Lots west of Roseville and the neighborhoods around Cross Hwy, Compo Rd North and Main St.
- Over the last 5-years, Long Lots, Kings Highway and Green Farms have the greatest share of sales while Coleytown and Saugatuck have the lowest share of sales
- After a low share in 2024, home sales have rebounded at Coleytown and to a lesser extent in Saugatuck, while other elementary schools saw a decline.

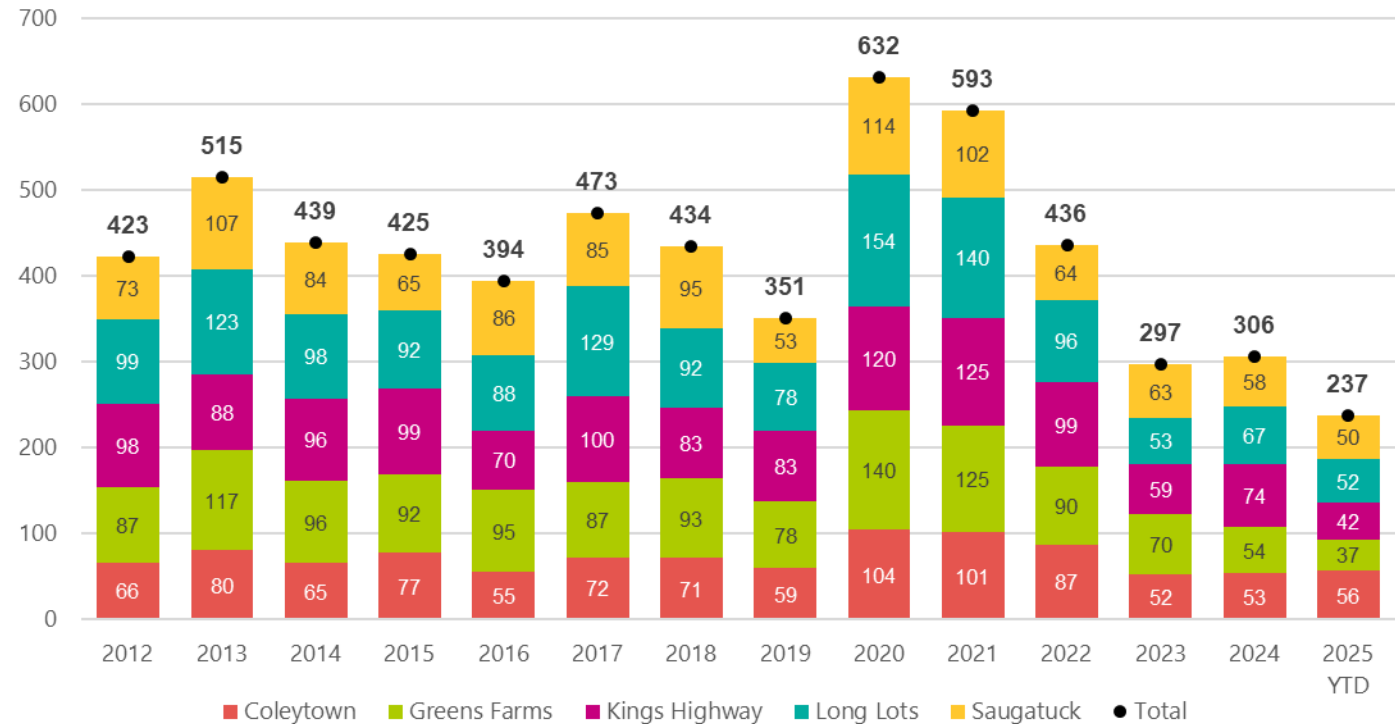




# Housing Market

- Much higher sales throughout all elementary districts in 2020 and 2021.
- Since 2020, sales are down -46% (Coleytown) to - 74% (Greens Farms)
- Over the last 3-years, home sales decreased for all elementary schools.
- YTD sales for 2025 in Coleytown have exceeded 2024 full year totals, all other elementary schools are trending below.

### Westport Home Sales by Elementary District 2012 to 2025 YTD



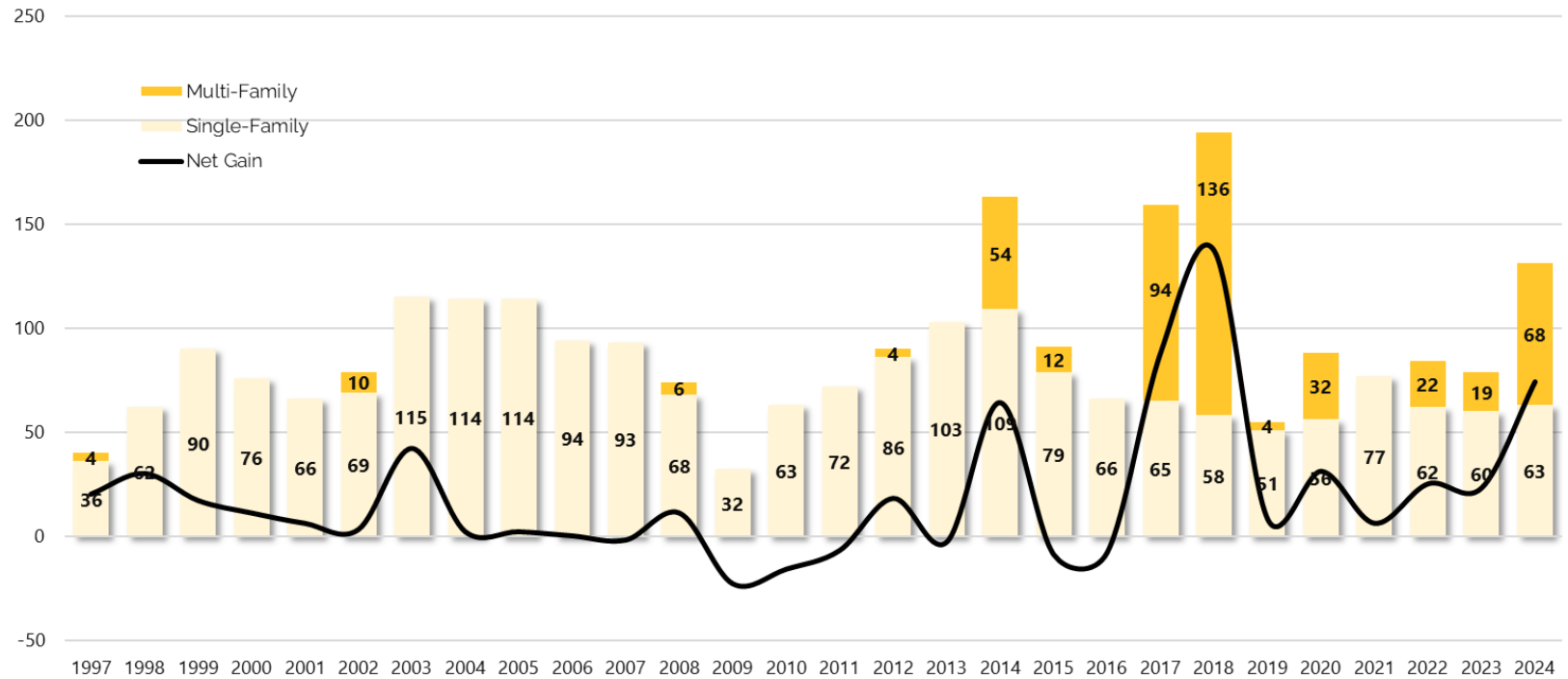

# Housing Trends

- Teardown/rebuilds continue to predominate in a largely built-out community; over the last ten years, Westport has seen 629 single-family permits, 534 multi-family permits and 549 demolition permits. Total activity results in a net gain of 612 units over the last decade.
- Sizable net gains in 2017, 2018 and 2024 tied to new multi-family construction.
- For 2025, Hiwatha Lane building permits (Buildings A-C) have been issued, totaling 157 units, which are not captured on the chart to the right.

- 122 Wilton Road is completed and generating students (15 students as of 10/1 enrollment)
- The Village at Hiawatha Lane & 85 Post Road West are under construction with completion and leasing in the near future.
- Zucaro Apartments project was withdrawn in spring of 2024.
- Smaller development at 259 Riverside is approved, however, student multipliers will not be added to the base forecast for these developments since they are included in the baseline forecast.
- Hamlet at Saugatuck (57 dwelling units) plus mixed use was denied. Future of this development bears watching.

Multipliers and student generation developed based on most recent information on units split and affordability percentage. Multipliers from comparable apartment and condo properties in Fairfield County & ESI Multipliers

- Multi-family development varies from year-to-year, based on a project-by-project basis, averaging 28 units annually over the last 5-years. Students generated from imminent future housing developments (above) were added locally to the baseline projections.
- Over the last 5-years, Westport has averaged 64 single family and 28 multi-family housing units annually. are captured in the baseline persistency ratios and are "built in" to the projections model and therefore student generation was not added.
- For Hiawatha Lane and the Lighthouse Westport, students from these developments have been phased into the projections based on the anticipated construction schedule, certificates of occupancy and lease up periods. The first students start impacting the projections in 2026-27 and are incrementally added thereafter, reaching full generation by 2030-31.



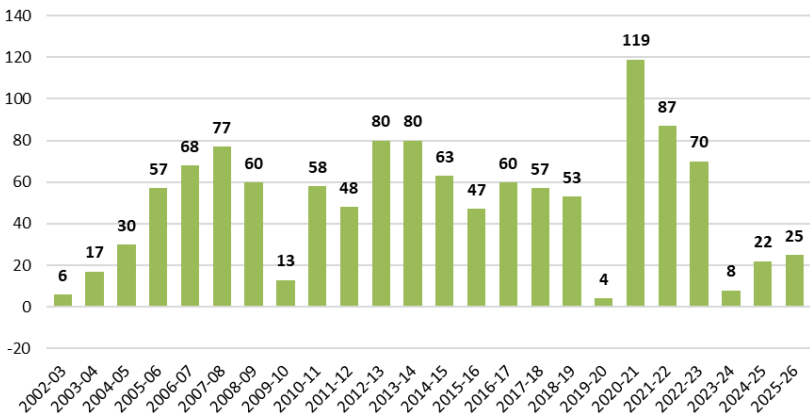

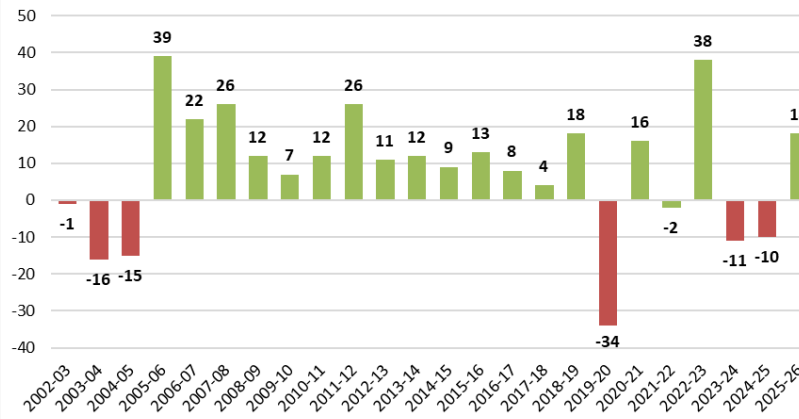

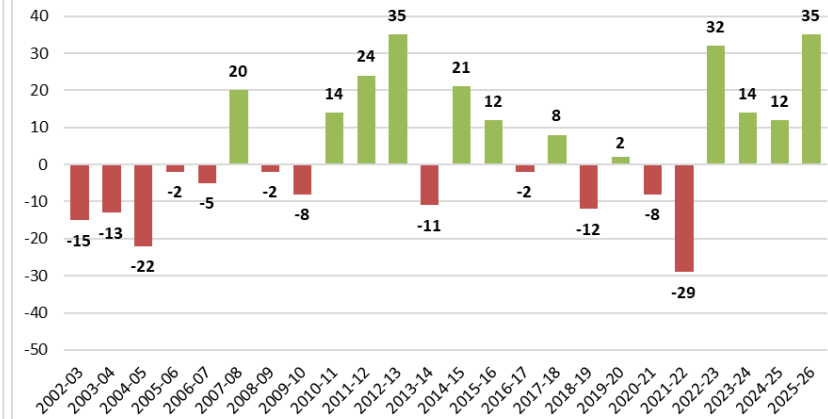
### Historic Elementary Net Migration

### Historic High School Net Migration

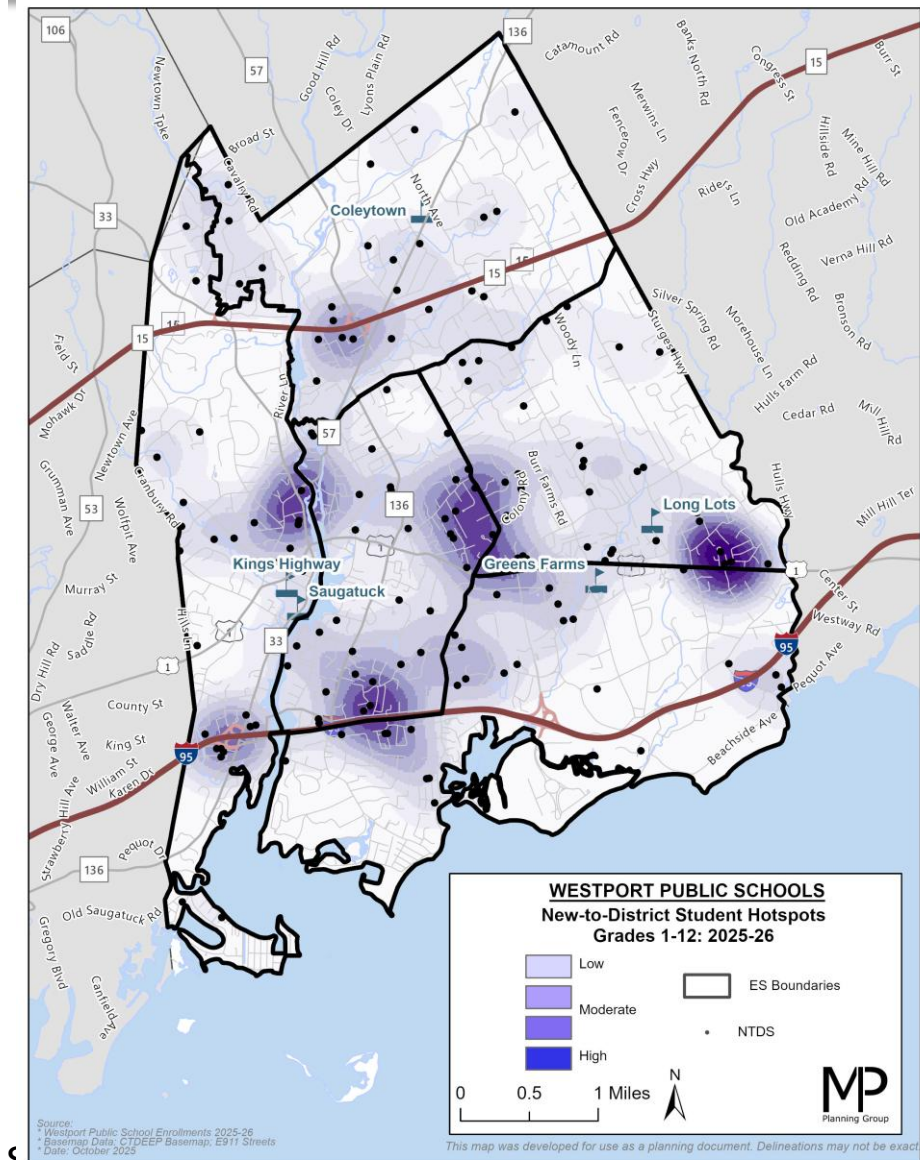
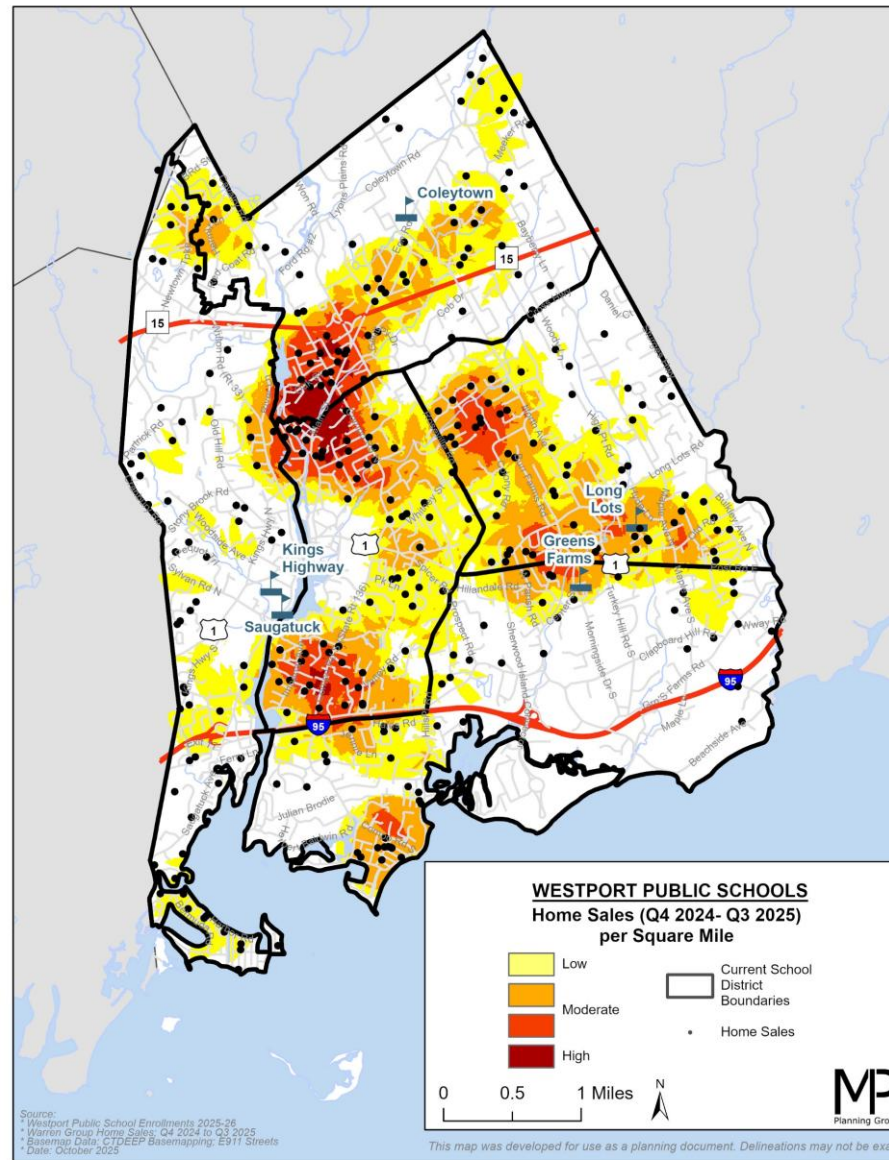


- After a period of strong elementary net in-migration from 2020-21 to 2022-23, net in-migration for the last three-years averaged just 18 students. Declining in-migration corresponds with declining home sales.
- After seeing out-migration in 2023-24 and 2024-25, the middle school grades saw net in-migration for 2025-26.
- Over the last decade, high school averages a modest net in-migration of +5 students with net in-migration over the last 4-years, including in-migration of 35 students for 2025-26.

- A side-by-side comparison of "Hot Spots" for home sales and "New Students" shows a good alignment except in Compo Beach area and the area around Cross Hwy, Compo Rd North and Main St.

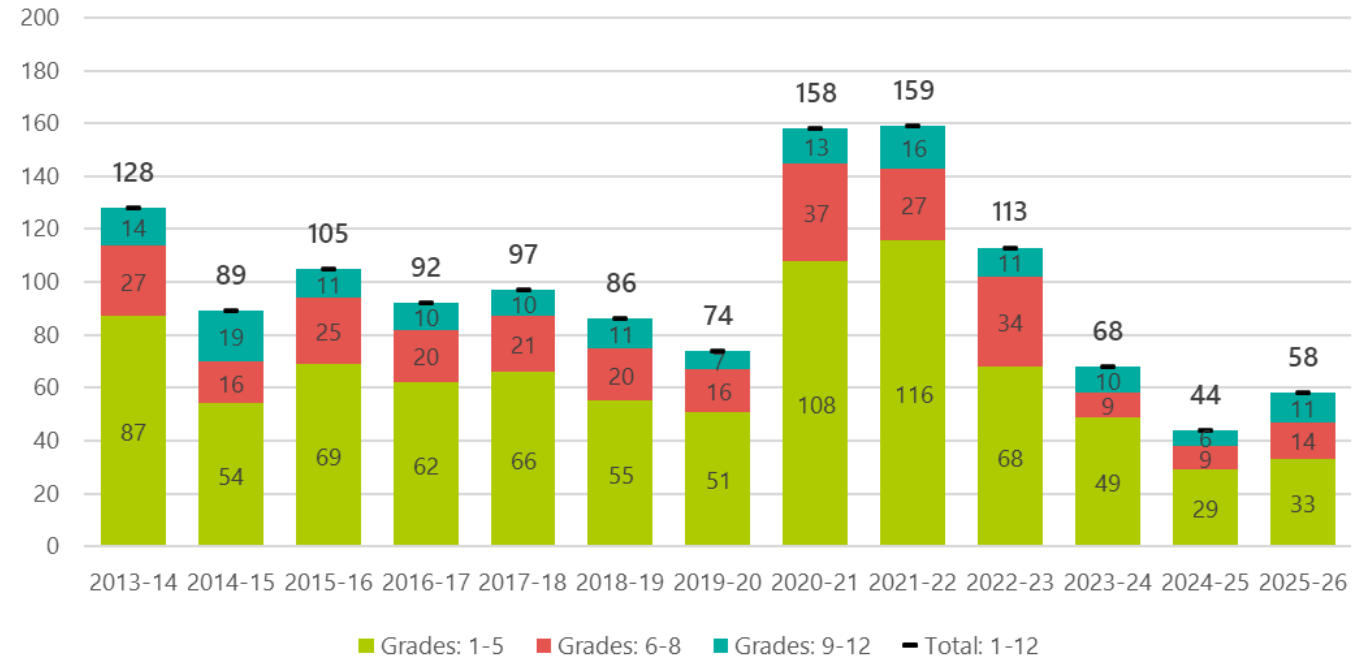




# Housing Market & Student Migration

- Matching of known home sales to new-to-district students entering the system (unique ID not present in prior year) yields an estimate of students generated from housing turnover
- After two years of very strong migration linked to home sales in 2020-21 and 2021-22, the number of new-to-district students has decreased, reaching a low of 44 in 2024-25.
- For 2025-26, there was an increase to 58 students, with modest increases across all grade levels. However, still trending well below pre-pandemic levels.

New to District Students Attributed to the Prior Year's Home Sales (2013-14 to 2025-26)

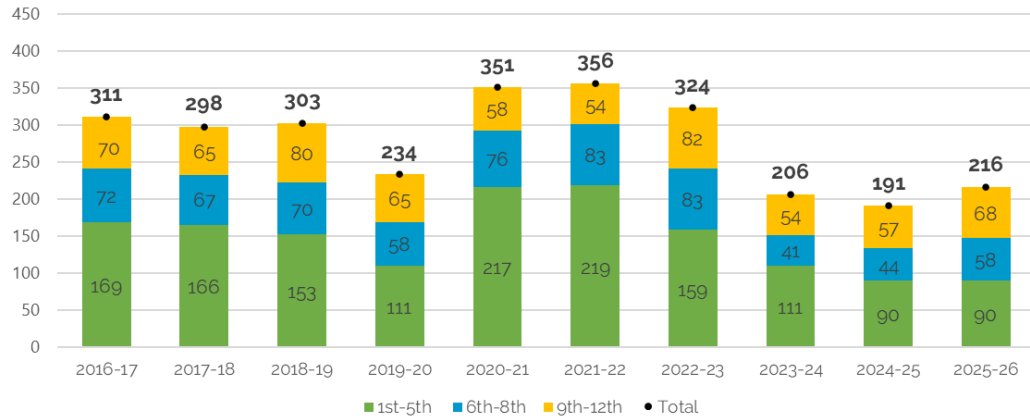

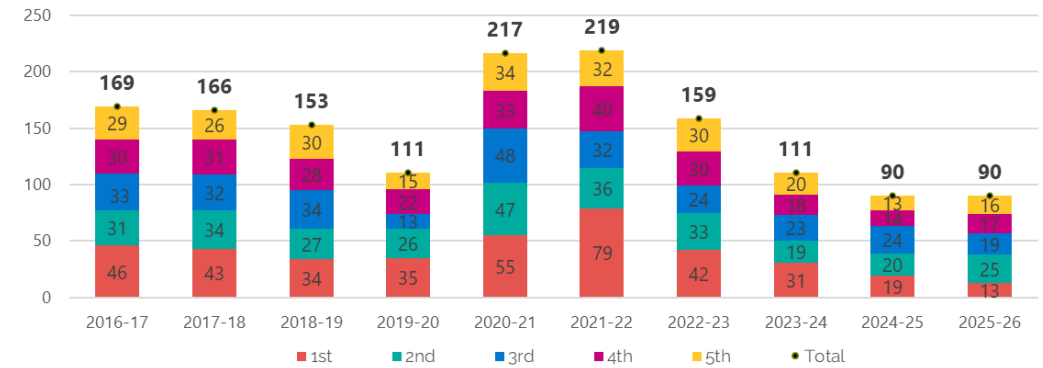

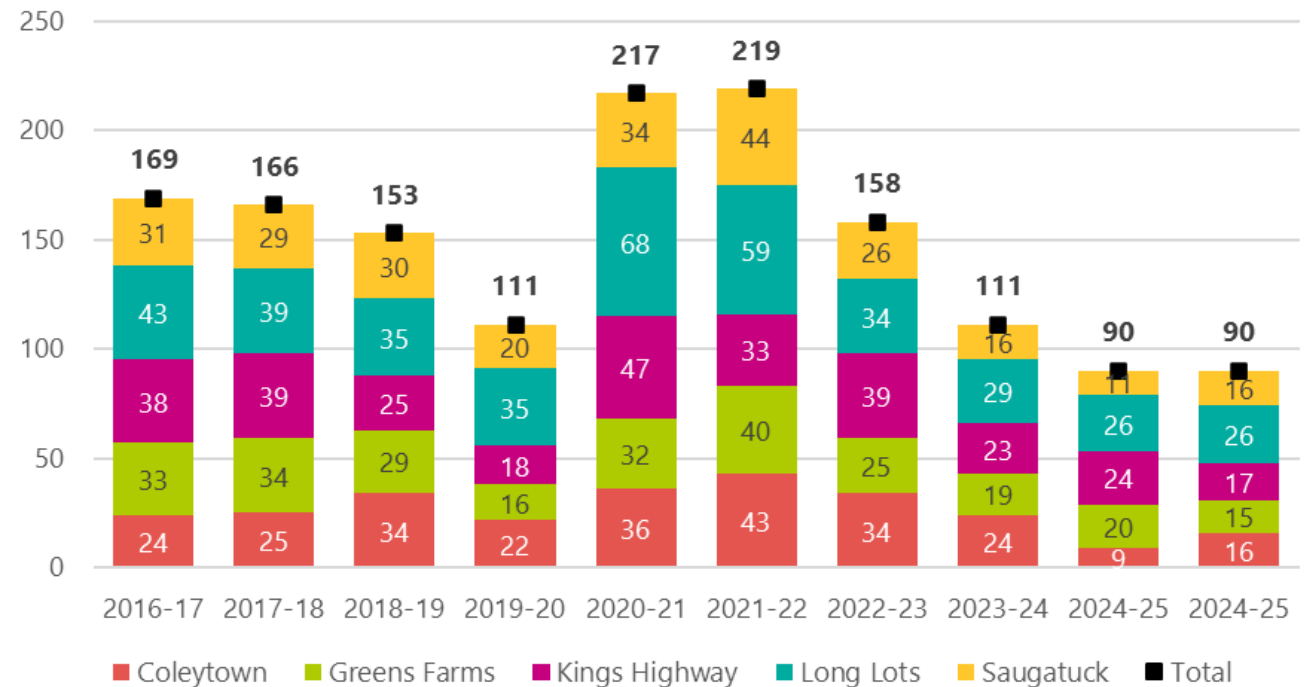
- The total number of "New to District (NTD)" was identified by comparing unique student identifiers (SASID's) that were not enrolled the previous year (excludes K). This includes students that are attributed to home sales on the previous slide.
- Overall, NTD students was down for the last 3-years averaging 204 students annually, lagging below pre-pandemic levels. Over the last 5-years, NTD student trends mirrored trends in housing sales.
- For Grades 1-5, there were a total of just 90 NTD student again for 2025-26, with 1<sup>st</sup> grade well below the 5-year historic average of 37 students.



# Student Migration

- Over the last 3-years, lower housing turnover and student in-migration is evident with all elementary schools trending well below the historic average.
- For 2025-26, Coleytown and Saugatuck saw a modest uptick compared to last year, while Long Lots was on par, and Greens Farms and Kings Highway both saw declines.
- Over the last 2-years, migration in 1<sup>st</sup> grade is roughly one-half the recent historic average.

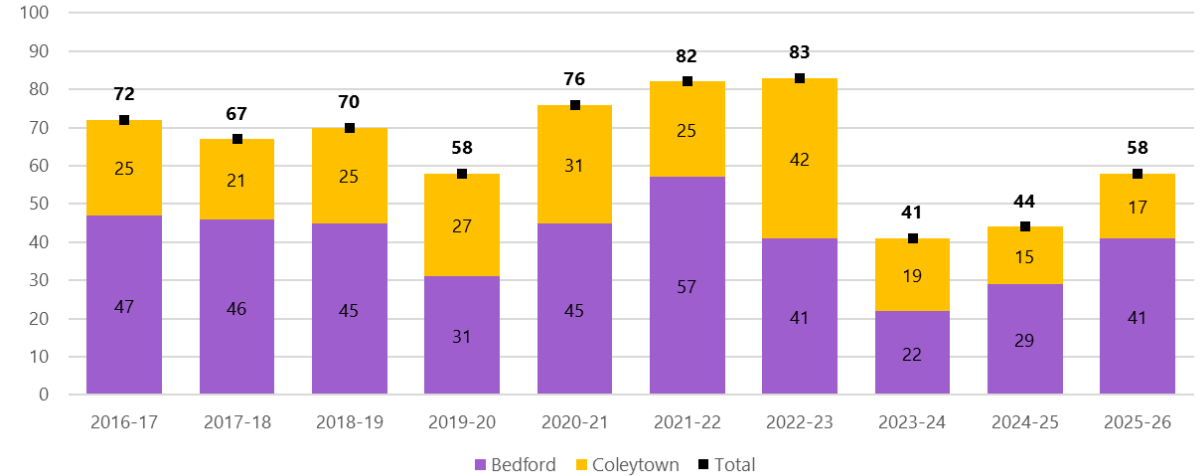

# Student Migration

- After elevated NTD middle students in 2021-22 and 2022-23, NTD students has been below the recent historic average.
- Historically, BMS has more new-to-district students at a roughly 60/40 split.
- For 2025-26, over 70% of NTD students attend BMS.

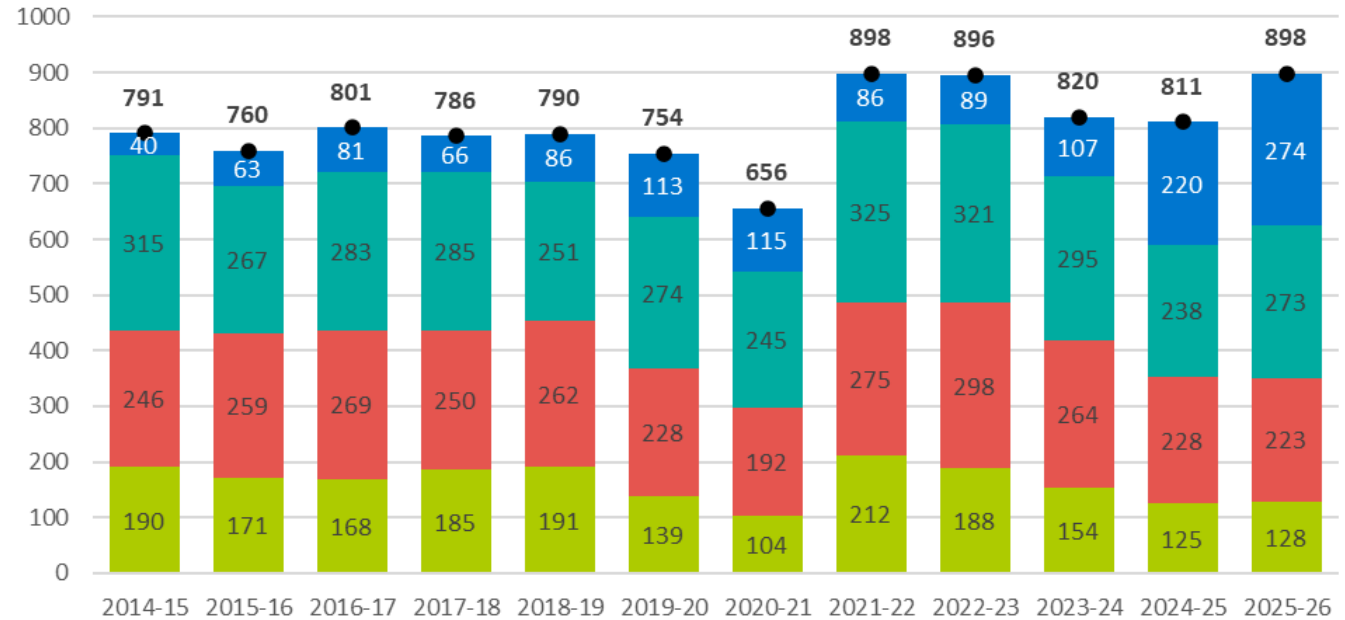

# Pre-K Analysis

- WPS tracks enrollment of Westport residents in public and private Pre-K programs.
- In the years leading up to the pandemic, enrollment was stable between 750-800 per year, with the largest enrollment typically in the PK4 cohort.
- Over the last two years, there has been a marked increase in PK5, presumably in response to the kindergarten entry age changes.
- For 2025-26, there are two large cohorts of PK4 and PK5 at levels above the prior year.

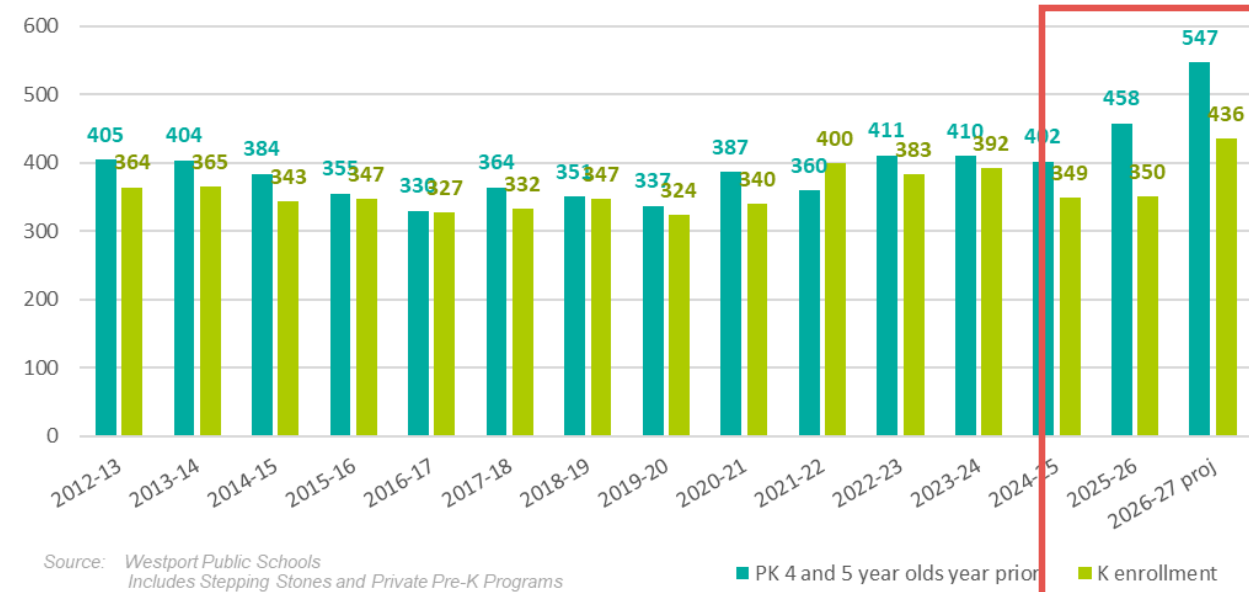

# Pre-K Analysis

- Historically prior to the change in kindergarten start dates, WPS Kindergarten enrollment was about 95% the size of the corresponding PK4 and PK5 class the year prior. However, with the K entry age change, that ratio dropped to 87% for 2024-25 and 76% in 2025-26.
- This method works well for a 1-year forecast but is not as reliable for long-term forecasting due to impact of in-migration.
- With the much higher-than-average enrollment in the current PK5 and PK4 cohorts, we anticipate larger kindergarten class next year than would be projected using a traditional approach.
- From the Pre-K Analysis, near term K projection models were modified accordingly.

### Comparison of Kindergarten Enrollment and PK4/5 Enrollment the Year prior

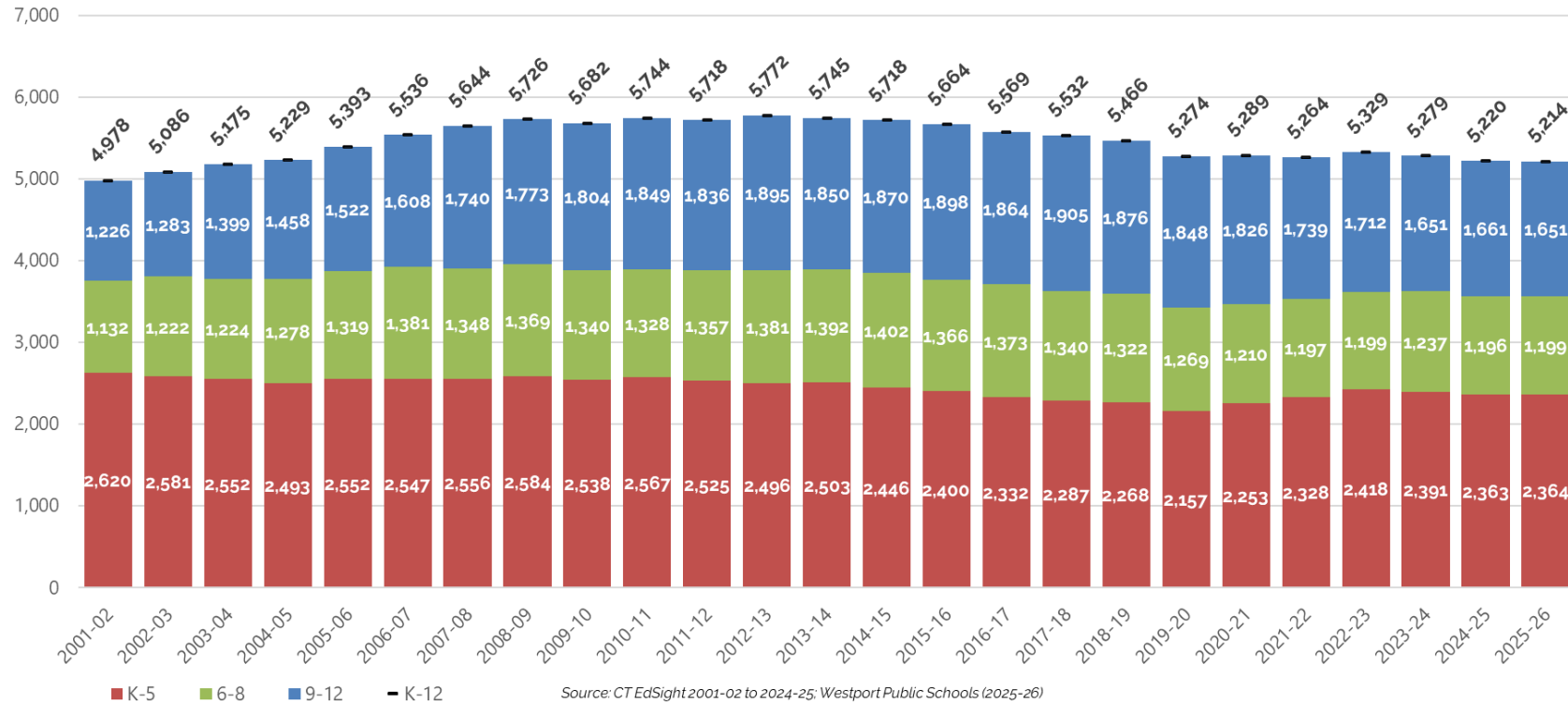




# Historic Enrollment

- Over the last 5-years, K-12 enrollment was stable averaging 5,261 students, however, different trends have been experienced at elementary, middle and high.
- Over the last 5-years:
  - ES enrollment increased by 111 students (5%)
  - MS enrollment declined by 11 students (-1%)
  - HS enrollment declined by 175 students (-10%)

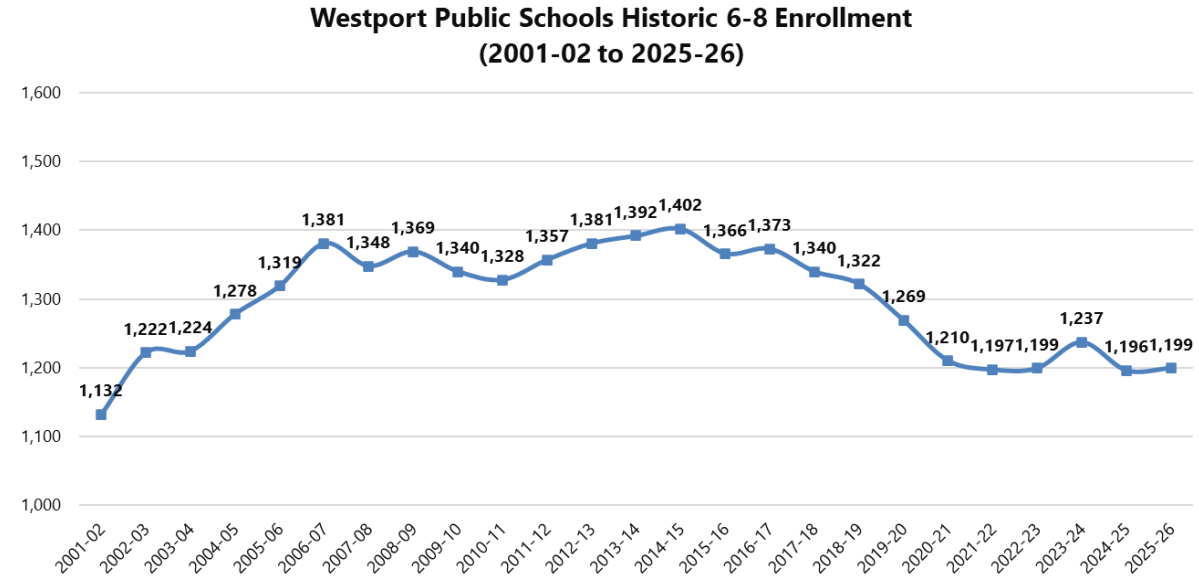
Pocket Redistricting of Long Lots to Saugatuck

- While overall elementary has increased by 11% over the last 5-years, trends vary by elementary school.
- Prior to the redistricting for 2025-26, Saugatuck enrollment was declining to below 400 students for 2024-25. With the recent redistricting enrollment is now 450 students. Subsequently, Long Lots enrollment was reduced to just below 550 students, which is on par with pre-pandemic levels.
- Greens Farms enrollment had been steadily increasing until 2025-26, which saw enrollment dip back to 450 students, largely due to much smaller K cohort.
- Kings Highway and Coleytown enrollment have been stable over the last 2-years, at roughly 450 and 460 students, respectively.



# Middle School Historic Enrollment

- Middle School enrollment experienced historic peak in 2014-15 (1,402 students) and has since decreased 15%.
- Enrollment has stabilized at about 1,200 students for the last five years, except for a one-year increase in 2023-24 to 1,237 students.
- However, enrollment trends vary by school. Since 2020-21, BMS enrollment declined by 7% and CMS enrollment increased by 10%.

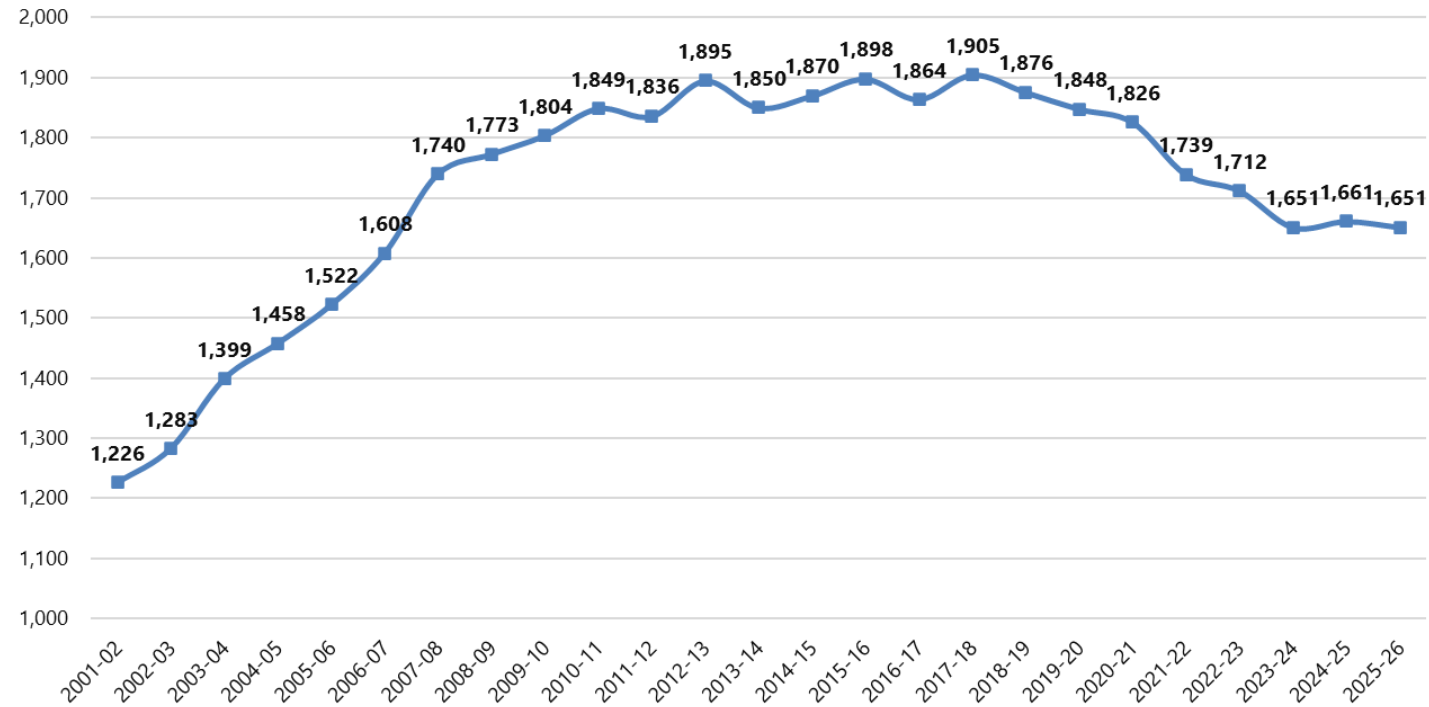

# 9-12 Historic Enrollment

- High school enrollment peaked at 1,905 students in 2017-18 and since declined by about 250 students (-13%).
- Over the last 3-years enrollment has stabilized around 1,655 students due to stabilization of graduating cohorts and incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders.

# Projections Primer

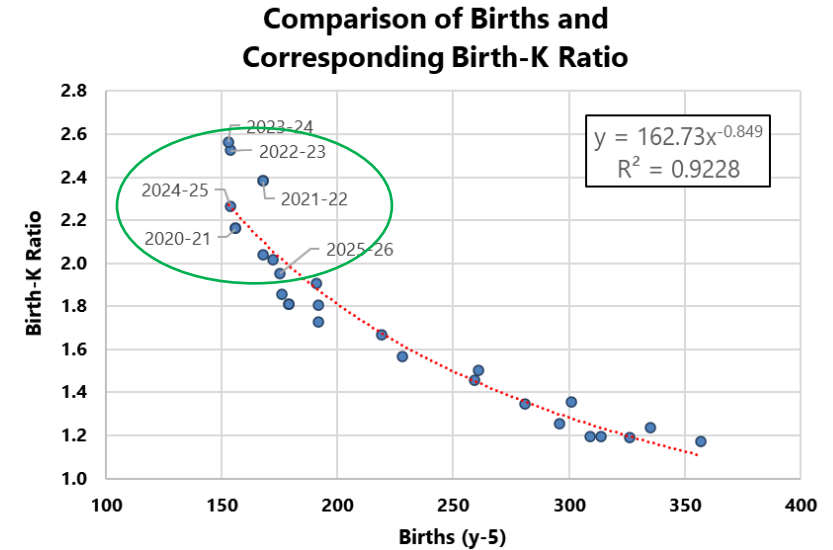
- Based on Cohort Survival Methodology – Standard method accepted by the OSCG&R for school construction projects
- The cohort survival methodology **relies on observed data from the recent past in order to project the near future**
- Persistency Ratios calculated from historic enrollment data to determine growth or loss in a class as it progresses through the school system
- Persistency Ratio of 1.0 means cohort size remains the same; 1.05 means the cohort size increases by 5%, or a cohort of 100 grows to 105 the following year
- Persistency Ratios account for the various external factors affecting enrollments: housing characteristics, residential development, economic conditions, student transfers in and out of system, and student mobility
- Changes in population, housing stock and tenure, and economic conditions help explain persistency ratios
- Changes in programming affect persistency ratios of individual schools
- Recent changes to Kindergarten entry age adds uncertainty to Kindergarten enrollment until trends are established.

- Over the last 2-years there has been a notable drop in the in Birth-K due to change in entry age.
- For 2025-26, estimations of migration have increased and are on par with the recent historic average after 2 years of lower migration.



# Projections Assumptions

These projections are predicated on the following assumptions:

- Pre-K enrollment will remain at recent levels for next 2-years and increase to 98 students in 2027-28 with the scheduled opening of the new Stepping Stones Program at Long Lots Elementary.
- Housing, student generation, and future birth assumptions at the districtwide level will prove accurate.
- Housing Multipliers for developments have been applied locally to all projection models for imminent projects not captured in the baseline. The recent pace of new home construction will continue.
- **High projections:** Assume high birth projections (average 197 annually) and housing sales will have a quicker return to pre-pandemic levels over the next 2-3 years. Student in-migration averages 1.5%, which is above the 5-year average
- **Medium projections:** Assume medium birth projections (average 188 annually), housing market slowly returns to pre-pandemic levels over the next 3-5 years. Student in-migration averages 1.2%, which aligns with 5-year historic average.
- **Low projections:** Assume low birth projections (average 177 annually) and housing activity remains at current level and in-migration averages 0.8%, which is below historic average.



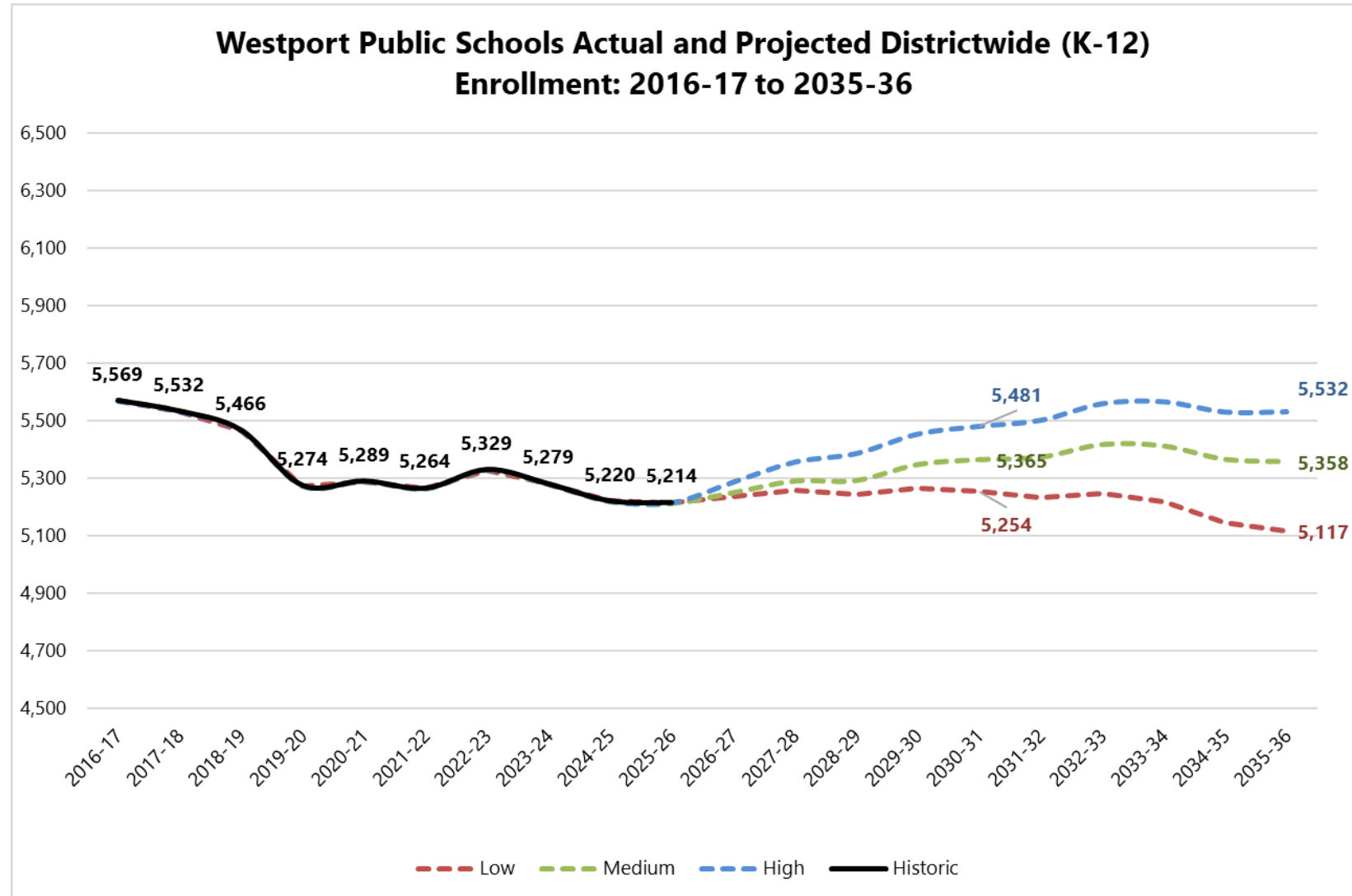
# Kindergarten Caveats & Assumptions

- Historically, variable Birth-K ratio was used to project K enrollment based on a historic “best fit” line with R-squared value of  $\sim 0.92$ , over the last two decades. However, this best fit line was below the elevated in-migration that WPS has seen from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Up until the recent change in Kindergarten entry age, kindergarten enrollment had corresponded well with the number of Westport resident 4- and 5-year-olds enrolled Pre-K programs (including private providers) the year prior.
  - Historically for every 100 PK4 and PK5 year olds typically results in  $\sim 95$  Kindergarteners the following year on average. However, with the change in entry date the yield dropped to  $\sim 86$  for 2024-25 and then again to 76% in 2025-26. It is anticipated that this will stabilize in the next year, and a new ratio will be established to help guide the projections.
  - The PK5 cohort for 2025-26 was over 270 students, over the 3 times the historic average prior to 2024. Additionally, the PK4 cohort for 2025-26 returned to the historic average.
  - Kindergarten projections for 2025-26 were revised upwards slightly to better align with corresponding PK cohorts.
  - Kindergarten projection has historically performed well using this model.



# Districtwide Projections

- Both the High and Medium Models agree, showing growth albeit at different levels, while the low model is projecting flatter enrollment.
- By 2030-31, all three models have a range of ~230 students.
- Under the medium model, K-12 averages 5,347 over the next decade with a peak of 5,417 students in 2032-33.
- **Recent housing conditions, demographics and enrollment in-migration align best with Medium Model and represents the most likely direction. However, recent housing conditions and demographic shifts should be monitored.**



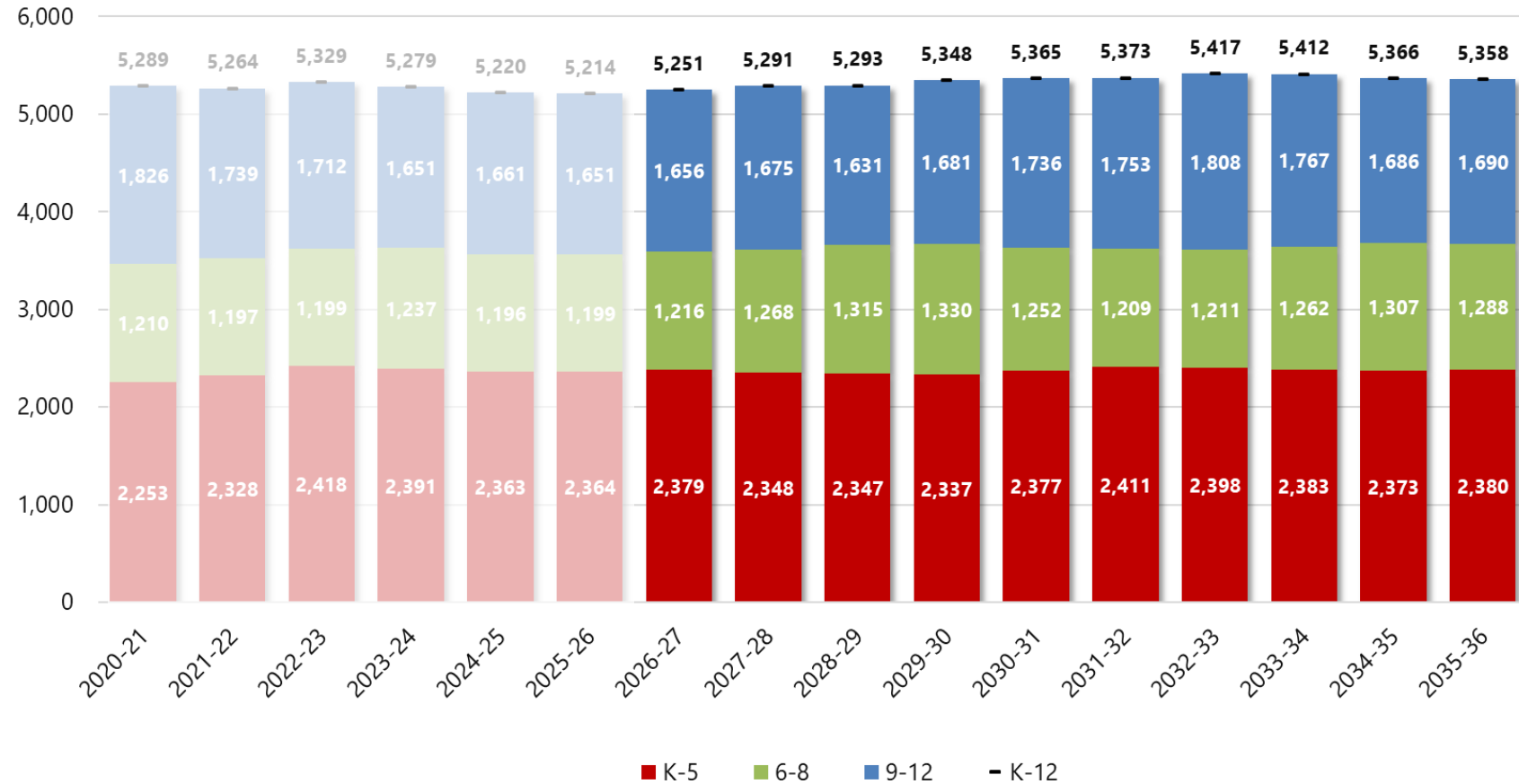

# Districtwide Projections

- K-5 enrollment is projected to remain stable over the next decade averaging 2,373 students, with a peak of 2,411 students in 2031-32
- 6-8 enrollment is projected to increase as larger elementary cohorts matriculate, with an enrollment increases of 4.4% over the next 5-years.
- 9-12 enrollment is projected to increase 5% over the next 5-years and peak in 2032-33 at 1,808 students..

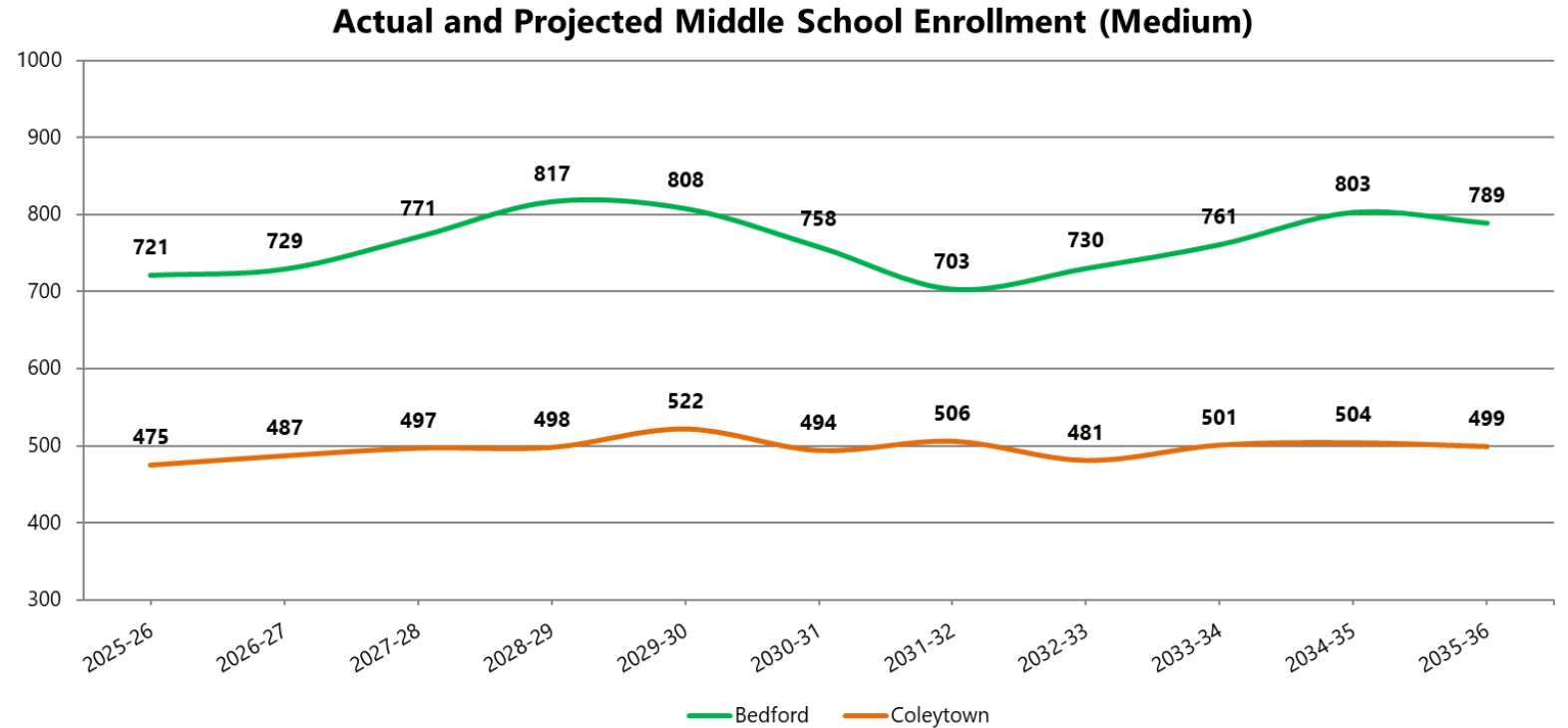

- Medium Model projections vary by school:
  - Long Lots is projected to increase 5% over next 5-years, averaging 566 students.
  - Coleytown is projected to decline by 7%, averaging 439 students over the next 5-years
  - Greens Farms is projected to stay relatively stable and average 457 students over next 5-years.
  - King’s Highway is to see the greatest growth with students from future housing contributing to an enrollment increase of 9% in the next 5-years.
  - Saugatuck’s enrollment is projected to continue to decrease slightly over the next 5-years (-4%), averaging 431 students.



# Middle School Projections (Medium)

- BMS is projected to average ~777 students the next 5-years with a peak of 817 students in 2028-29.
- Over the next decade BMS cohorts range from 223-289 students.
- CMS is projected to increase slightly by 4% in the next 5-years. Over the next decade enrollment averages 500 students and Cohorts range from 147-192 students.

# Projection Takeaways

- Projections revised downwards due to continuation of stagnant housing sales and smaller kindergarten cohort for 2025-26.
- **Medium Projection Model reflects the most likely trajectory for future enrollment.** However, recent changes to enrollment drivers bear watching.
- Overall K-12 enrollment is projected to increase by ~3% over the next five years, then growth slows; peaking in 2032-33 at ~5,420
- Elementary enrollments are projected to remain stable over the projection horizon with a peak in 2031-32 at 2,411 students
- Over the next 5-years, growth is projected at Long Lots (5%) & Kings Highway (9%), with fairly stable enrollment at Greens Farms, while Coleytown ES (-7%) and Saugatuck (-4%) are projected to modestly decline.
- Middle school enrollment is projected to grow modestly (+4%) over the next 5-years with projected increases at both BMS (+5%) and CMS (+4%)
- High school enrollment is projected to increase by 5% over the next 5-years, averaging 1,276 students.
